Re: Participation Criteria and Deadlines for the 2010 IPC Shooting World Championships

Dear NPC Representatives,

Following the 2009 Open Asian Championships and several International competitions, IPC Shooting would like to provide information related to the Participation Criteria and Deadlines for 2010 IPC Shooting World Championships to be held in Zagreb, Croatia on 16-24 July 2010.

Shooters Eligibility

To be eligible for selection by an NPC for the 2010 IPC Shooting World Championships shooters must:

- hold an active IPC Shooting license for the 2010 Season
- have achieved a Minimum Qualification Standard (MQS) at an IPC Shooting Recognized Competition for the respective event between the 1 January 2009 and 3 June 2010 or having obtained an MQS performance in the lead-up to the Beijing 2008 Paralympic Games; and
- be internationally classified with a "Review" (R) or "Confirmed" (C) sport class status before 04 June 2010.

Regulations

Competition Format

The 2010 IPC Shooting World Championships will be conducted in Single Sport Class competition format. Only single sport classes' events that meet the Event Viability Criteria outlined below after the Entry by Number will be included in the Final Event Programme. Combined events will not be offered.

All shooting times are according to ISSF rules (Edition 2009 First Printing, 11/2008)

Event Viability Criteria

Events are considered viable if they have a minimum of eight (8) eligible shooters from four (4) countries entered through the Entry by Number.

Team events will be considered viable if they have a minimum of four (4) eligible NPCs entered through the entry by number.

Maximum Entry per NPC

NPCs are allowed to enter three (3) athletes for individual events and only one team per event for team events.

Medals

Only one set of medals per event will be awarded.

In Team events medals will be presented to all team members participated in the event (e.g. 3 gold, 3 silver, 3 bronze).

Competition fee

The competition fee for the 2010 IPC Shooting World Championships is 550 FUR.

The competition fee covers all the Championships services including meals (lunch and dinner) and transport (to/from airport, official Championships hotels to venues) from the 15-24 July 2010 (official Championships period).

The competition fee is to be paid to IPC Shooting by 09 April 2010 in accordance to the invoice that will be sent by IPC Shooting to each NPC following the Entry by Number deadline.
