

IPC SWIMMING EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS FACT SHEET

Summary

The IPC Swimming European Championships are the largest regional competition for athletes with an impairment in the world. Past Championships have been successful in terms of athlete performances, sponsor support, logistical support and media coverage. The 2009 IPC Swimming European Championships hosted 420 athletes from 35 countries, while the 2011 edition hosted 445 athletes from 36 countries.

Approximately 170 medal events are on the official programme.

Accommodation and Transport

Organisers have to provide athletes and NPC team officials access to an accessible hotel style accommodation with accessible transport to and from ports of entry, training, and competition sites.

Accommodation facilities and services have to be equivalent to a minimum of a 3 star European standard, wheelchair accessible and



generally suitable for people with impairment. NPC Teams cover for their own accommodation.

The Championships Officials, IPC Guests and the media have to be accommodated in a separate location/area from that of athletes and NPC team officials. Media representatives cover for their own accommodation.

A sufficient number of 3 to 4 star European standard hotels for the Friends & Families is required.

Media

The IPC Swimming Europeans Championships has to have media (written and photographic press) and rights holding broadcasters providing daily coverage of the competition. Furthermore, the IPC provided web cast coverage of the Championships on www.Paralympicsport.tv.

Budget

Average 1.000.000 – 1.400.000 Euro IPC Swimming will financially contribute to the success of the Championships, as well as provide technology support.
