2017 IPC General Assembly – opening of bidding process

Dear Paralympic Family,

Today, we have opened the bidding process for the 2017 IPC General Assembly, related meetings and Paralympic Awards Gala.

The 2017 meeting will act as a significant landmark in history of the Paralympic Movement. It will see the election of a new IPC President for the first time in 16 years, together with the election of a Vice President and ten Governing Board members. The high profile Paralympic Awards will also recognise the achievements of athletes and the media from the Rio 2016 Paralympic Games

Up to 550 people are expected to attend the 2017 General Assembly, bringing a sizeable short-term economic impact to the host city. Hosting the event can also highlight the city and country's support of the Paralympic Movement and showcase the accessibility of the host city.

Due to the election of a new IPC President in 2017, global interest in the event, especially amongst the media, is expected to be significant. As a result we have changed the bid application process slightly from previous editions. The bid documentation for the 2017 IPC General Assembly includes the following:
