

IPC Approved Event: Anti-Doping Programme Information

Under the provisions of the International Paralympic Committee's (IPC) approval, it is the Local Organizing Committee's (LOC) responsibility to deliver an Anti-Doping Programme. This Anti-Doping programme shall be in accordance with the scope and size of the event.

The Anti-Doping Programme needs to be conducted in compliance with the World Anti- Doping Code (WADC) and the WADC International Standards for Testing and Investigations (ISTI).

In providing the Anti-Doping programme, particular attention should be given to the WADC articles 7.1 and 7.1.1.:

WADC, Article 7.1: "Except as provided in Articles 7.1.1 and 7.1.2 below, results management and hearings shall be the responsibility of, and shall be governed by, the procedural rules of the anti-doping organization that initiated and directed Sample collection (or, if no Sample collection is involved, the Anti-Doping organization which first provides notice to an athlete or other Person of an asserted anti-doping rule violation and then diligently pursues that anti-doping rule violation). Regardless of which organization conducts results management or hearings, the principles set forth in this Article and Article 8 shall be respected and the rules identified in Article 23.2.2 to be incorporated without substantive change must be followed (...)".

WADC, Article 7.1.1.1: "In circumstances where the rules of a National Anti-doping Organization do not give the National Anti-Doping Organization authority over an athlete or other Person who is not a national, resident, license holder, or member of a sport organization of that country, or the National Anti-Doping

Organization declines to exercise such authority, results management shall be conducted by the applicable International Federation (...)."

In terms of reporting, the Anti-Doping Organization shall notify the International Federation (IF) and the World Anti- Doping Agency (WADA) on the outcome of any investigation on possible anti-doping rule violations in accordance with the provisions set forth in WADC article 14.1.2.
